Named Awards

Michael J. Shaara Undergraduate Research and Creative Activity Award--This award was established by FSU alumnus, Linda Lewis in memory of Pulitzer Prize winning author, Michael J. Shaara who taught at Florida State University from 1961-1973 and made a lasting impact on her life. Shaara was awarded the Pulitzer Prize in 1975 for his novel, The Killer Angels which is historical fiction about the Battle of Gettysburg and the Civil War. This award is for a student majoring in English or Creative Writing.

David B. Ford Undergraduate Research and Creative Activity Award--Named for David B. Ford of New York, New York who is currently the President of DBF Associates, a private investment firm, and Senior Advisor to Gatemore Capital Management, LLC, a private wealth and institutional investment management firm. This award is open to all majors.

Scott and Ina McNichols Undergraduate Research Award--Scott and Ina McNichols are both FSU alumni who have a deep desire to support research which provides an enriching experience for the student engaged in research who wants to better the community around them. This award is open to all majors.

Helen Louise Lee Undergraduate Research Award--This award was established by Dr. Jim Lee in memory of his mother Helen who was a proponent of higher education and the ways it can help students enhance their lives. This award is for a student majoring in Biology.

Nancy Casper Hillis and Mark Hillis Undergraduate Research Award--Mark and Nan Hillis are vibrant FSU supporters who want to support undergraduate research that embodies the Unconquered Seminole spirit. This award is open to all majors.
